

Designed for safety, with flashing lights, giant mirrors, high seat backs and that bright yellow color, school buses keep more than 17 million cars away from school buildings every day.

The National Safety Council has released a groundbreaking report on pediatric vehicular heatstroke (PVH) titled, *Kids in Hot Cars; a Legislative Look Across the U.S.*

On average, <u>37 children die each year</u> due to PVH; 42 children died during 2017, alone. All of these deaths were preventable.

In an effort to better understand and document this risk, NSC works with partner experts, including Jan Null, a certified consulting meteorologist and adjunct professor at San Jose State University. Mr. Null has been tracking child deaths resulting from vehicular heatstroke <u>since 1998</u>, and his work provides the basis for data and information in this report.
