

NJSIG recommends that every school district have a **safety committee**. A safety committee is a group of school district employees who meet periodically to identify and recommend solutions on safety concerns throughout the district.

The benefits of having a safety committee:

- Develop and promote a healthy and safe environment for all employees
- Encourages communication about safety
- May lower your NJSIG contributions

Functions of a safety committee:

- Increase the awareness of safety at the district
- Identify/eliminate workplace safety hazards
- Reduce/manage the amount of workplace injuries
- Discuss accidents / potential issues in an open forum
- Recommend corrective actions to prevent recurrences

Forming a committee:


- Appoint a "strong" leader
- If districts have multiple buildings, have representation from each
- Diverse membership:
 - · Business administrator
 - · Buildings and grounds
 - School nurse
 - Resource officer
 - District risk manager
 - School safety specialist
 - Think of including: bus drivers, lunch room aides, custodian/ maintenance
 - Include your broker and your NJSIG Member Services Representative
