



Top 5 Claims Reported





Angela N. Mincy, Superintendent of **NJSIG member Newark's Marion P. Thomas Charter School**, is reimagining education by fostering a culturally rich environment for its 1,400 predominantly Black and Hispanic students. The school, known as "The Village," emphasizes the importance of history, culture and community support. Mincy, a Newark native, partners with various organizations to enhance curricula with culturally responsive pedagogy and aims to combat the negative impacts of social media and COVID-19 disruptions on students' engagement and academic performance.

Newark won New Jersey's first <u>FAFSA Challenge</u> against Camden, with 55% of its high school seniors completing the FAFSA compared to Camden's 48%. Newark's St. Vincent Academy, **NJSIG member North Star Academy**, Donald M. Payne Sr. School of Technology, and Malcolm X Shabazz High School excelled in their categories, receiving cash prizes for their efforts. Mayor Baraka and educational leaders praised the competition for encouraging students to secure financial aid for higher education, despite challenges with the FAFSA application process.
