As the new school year approaches, NJSIG encourages all members to conduct an annual review of their school safety and security procedures. Taking a proactive approach helps identify potential vulnerabilities, enhance preparedness, and support a safe learning environment for students, staff, and visitors.

Before welcoming students back, consider completing the following:

- Review your School Safety & Security Plan.
- Verify emergency contacts and communication systems.
- Inspect playgrounds, athletic facilities, and school grounds.
- Check first aid kits, AEDs, and other emergency equipment.
- Ensure required staff safety training is completed.
- Conduct a final facility walk-through before students return.
